## The Three guṇas

### Introduction to Tamo guṇa and Rajo guṇa

Śankarācārya's text transitions from discussing Rajo guṇa to exploring Tamo guṇa, explaining how these two qualities work together to create the experience of Samsara (worldly existence and suffering).

### Rajo guṇa - The Projecting Power (Vikṣepa Śakti)

**Definition:** Rajo guṇa possesses Vikṣepa Śakti - the projecting, disturbing, or activity power.

#### Characteristics:

- Makes human beings utterly restless
- Creates constant movement and fidgetiness
- Generates endless mental projections and imaginations
- Produces self-identifications and conclusions

### Tamo guṇa - The Veiling Power (Āvaraṇa Śakti)

**Definition:** Tamo guṇa possesses Āvaraṇa Śakti - the veiling, covering, or hiding power.

#### Two Meanings of Tamas:

1. Darkness (external) - Bāhya Tamas
2. Ignorance (internal) - Āntara Tamas

**Why Both Are Called Tamas:** Both darkness and ignorance share the quality of concealing reality. External darkness hides physical objects from perception, while internal ignorance conceals the ultimate truth of one's nature.

## The Rope-Snake Analogy



## Understanding the Two Powers Through Example

Vedānta uses the classic rope-snake example to illustrate how Āvaraṇa Śakti and Vikṣepa Śakti work together:

### Stage 1: Āvaraṇa Śakti (Veiling)

In twilight (semi-darkness), a rope lies on the ground. The darkness veils the true nature of the rope, making it unclear and unrecognizable. This is the covering power of Tamo guṇa.

### Stage 2: Vikṣepa Śakti (Projection)

Because the rope's true nature is hidden, the mind doesn't remain quiet with "I don't know." Instead, it begins projecting various possibilities:

- "Maybe it's a snake"
- "Perhaps it's a garland"
- "It could be a flexible stick"
- "Maybe it's just a crack in the ground"

**Key Insight:** There is only ONE fact (the rope), but ignorance leads to MULTIPLE projections. The more fertile and creative the mind, the more projections it generates. (Acharya Tadany)

## Application to Self-Knowledge

### The Ultimate Fact: Aham Brahmāsmi

Just as there is only one fact about the rope, there is only one fact about yourself:

**Aham Brahmāsmi** - I am Brahman (the complete, infinite, free reality)

This is not F-O-O-L (fool) but F-U-L-L (complete). The true nature is:

- Complete (Pūrṇa)
- Free
- Infinite consciousness
- Always available in one's own mind

### How Ignorance Creates Self-Projections

However, Āvaraṇa Śakti (Tamo guṇa) veils this truth, and then Vikṣepa Śakti (Rajo guṇa) creates countless self-projections:

#### Physical Projections (Body-Based)

- I am male/female
- I am young/old
- I am healthy/sick
- I am tall/short
- I am lean/fat

#### Emotional Projections (Mind-Based)

- I am happy/unhappy
- I am calm/restless



- I am angry/peaceful
- I am sad/joyful
- I am attached/detached

**Intellectual Projections (Intellect-Based)**

- I am educated/uneducated
- I am intelligent/dull
- I have a degree/no degree
- I am an engineer/doctor/teacher
- I am successful/unsuccessful

**Critical Understanding:** The constant in all these statements is "I AM." Everything that follows "I am" represents the projecting power of Rajo guṇa - these are all non-Brahman descriptions that replace the ultimate truth. (Acharya Tadany)

## The Problem of Replacement

### Why Replacing Brahman Creates Suffering

Vedānta teaches a fundamental principle:

Whenever we replace Brahman (completeness) with anything else, there will ALWAYS be problems, regardless of how great that "something else" appears to be.

### Examples of Incomplete Fulfillment

Even the most accomplished individuals experience incompleteness:

Achievement	What's Still Missing
Tennis champion with multiple Grand Slams	"I've won Australia, Wimbledon, and Paris, but not the US Open"
Multiple PhD degrees	"But I don't know Sanskrit" (or some other field)
Immense wealth	"But my health is declining and my children are fighting over inheritance"
President or Prime Minister	Facing threats of world war, political opposition, or other crises

**Universal Truth:** You can have anything in life, but you will always miss something. This sense of incompleteness (Apūrṇatva) is inevitable when Brahman is replaced by any limited identity. (Acharya Tadany)

## The Ladder of Suffering (Bhagavad Gītā Chapter 2)

### The Progressive Descent



The Bhagavad Gītā (Chapter 2, verses 62-63) describes how misapprehension leads to complete destruction through a systematic process:

1. **Dhyāyato viṣayān** - Contemplating sense objects
2. **Saṅgaḥ** - Attachment develops
3. **Kāma** - Desire arises (mind becomes convinced that happiness depends on that object)
4. **Krodha** - Anger/frustration when desire is unfulfilled
5. **Sammohāt** - Delusion (anger clouds the mind, perspective is lost)
6. **Smṛti-vibhramah** - Confusion and loss of memory (forgetting past lessons, teacher's words, and personal values)
7. **Buddhi-nāśah** - Destruction of intellect (discriminating power disappears, cannot discern between what is beneficial and what is harmful)
8. **Praṇaśyati** - Complete destruction (person acts impulsively, driven by senses, jealousy, anger, and fear)

**Important Teaching:** This ladder of destruction begins with simple perception and contemplation, but through the combined power of Āvaraṇa Śakti and Vikṣepa Śakti, leads to complete suffering. This progression is worth revisiting as often as possible for self-awareness. (Acharya Tadany)

## Non-Apprehension and Misapprehension

### Swami Chinmayānanda's Terminology

Swami Chinmayānanda used a beautiful pair of terms to describe these two powers:

English Term	Sanskrit Equivalent	Associated guṇa
Non-apprehension	Āvaraṇa Śakti	Tamo guṇa
Misapprehension (Misconception)	Vikṣepa Śakti	Rajo guṇa

### Presence in Different States of Consciousness

State	Non-apprehension	Misapprehension	Result
Deep Sleep	Present	Absent	No problems - peaceful like an angel
Dream State	Present	Present	Problems arise - nightmares possible
Waking State	Present	Present	Problems arise - suffering experienced



**Peaceful Sleep:** During deep sleep, only non-apprehension (ignorance) exists without misapprehension (projection). This is why everyone sleeps peacefully like an angel - even the most difficult person becomes peaceful in sleep. Sometimes it's the only time families have peace, hoping the person sleeps as long as possible!

## The Harmonious Partnership of Suffering

### Perfect Cooperation

Śankarācārya emphasizes that Āvaraṇa Śakti and Vikṣepa Śakti work together with:

- Total cooperation
- No quarrels or disagreements
- No fights or mood changes
- Perfect harmony and integration

**The Largest Project:** These two powers are ideal business partners maintaining the largest project ever - Saṃsāra (the cycle of worldly existence and suffering). They keep this project alive continuously and flawlessly.

## Key Philosophical Principles

### The Availability of Truth

According to Vedānta, the ultimate truth (Brahman) is:

- Always available in the form of consciousness
- Present in your own mind
- Never distant or separate from you
- Your true nature (Svarūpa)

The Upaniṣad declares: "*Guhāyāṃ nihitam*" - The one who dwells in the cave (of the heart/mind).

### The Universal Search

The entire world, including science, seeks this ultimate truth:

- Humanity searches for ultimate reality
- Science declares finding the truth of the universe as its ultimate goal
- Yet this truth is intimately available to each person
- It is available as the consciousness principle in one's own mind



**The Paradox:** What the entire world is searching for externally is already present internally. The truth is covered not by distance but by the veiling power of ignorance (Āvaraṇa Śakti). (Acharya Tadanu)

- The glory of Rajo guṇa
- The power of Vikṣepa Śakti
- Projections that replace Brahman
